

COPPERTONE® Solar Research Center's Guide to Potential Topics to be Addressed by the FDA's Final Sunscreen Monograph Rule

In anticipation of the FDA's upcoming final sunscreen monograph, the COPPERTONE® Solar Research Center developed a checklist to "RAISE" consumer awareness of possible changes to the suncare category. The tool below can serve as a guide to help consumers navigate anticipated changes:

- ✓ **R**ating UVA Protection: New UVA information will likely be required on sunscreen labels in addition to SPF.
- ✓ **A**nti-Aging: Products with SPF may be further limited in making claims related to premature skin aging.
- ✓ **I**ngredients: New active ingredients or active ingredient combinations could be approved.
- ✓ **S**PF Cap: SPF values may be capped (for example, a proposed cap of SPF 50+ might be enacted).
- ✓ **E**xpression of Claims: Claims language on sunscreen labels could change. For instance, the word "sunblock" may no longer be permitted to appear anywhere on product labeling. All products would be labeled "sunscreens."
